CLIMATE CHANGE COMMUNITY RESEARCH CO-ORDINATOR

DEVELOPING ADAPTATION STRATEGIES FOR HEALTHY FISHERIES AND FOOD SECURITY UNDER CLIMATE CHANGE is a 5-year research study that will look at food security and nutrition issues under climate change in four coastal First Nations in British Columbia. The project is funded by the Canadian Institute of Health Research.

Community Researcher Coordinator responsibilities are listed below:

- Act as the key liaison between the study staff and the community
- Lead a team of Community Researchers in conducting interviews and surveys with community members.
- Assist in training of Community Researchers on surveying and interviewing techniques
- Participate in two 3- to 4-day co-learnings covering surveying and interviewing techniques
- Maintain a complete and accurate record of study activities in the community.
- Lead regular meetings with the community to update them on study progress, milestones and objectives.
- Assist with the development and organization of community engagement activities such as workshops or forums.

- Experience working on research projects or with research teams is preferred.

- Knowledge of local language is preferred but not required
